She created two connectors from the Sweetheart Tree Trail to the JRT so that we had easier access and ability to work on the JRT in sections. The trail is 90% opened all the way. Two three more big trees to chain saw through. Many thanks to another GS volunteer, her husband Kevin, who has been her right hand person in trail work along with splitting fire wood and helping us create the new parking area at Tanglewood. P.S. Can't forget to mention Zoey and Lily, their trail dogs, and hand painted "Ricky" on the kiosk as you come down the camp road hill created by Glo.

We have really enjoyed Sac's Pollinator Garden located in the fenced in area just across from Little Sac's Orchard. The maze is laid down early in the season before the corn begins to sprout, to insure that the paths are foot friendly and not studded with stubble. 
#### Camp Sacajawea

- Sunspot Badge Barn and Resource Center (yellow building) features a well stocked library, multiple activity tubs: Scavenger Hunt, Public Speaking, Trees, Fairy Trail Adventure (D/B/J), Bugs, JGL Catch the Spirit, Astronomy/Space Explorer, How Pulleys Work, Fossils and Earthquakes, Hiker, Outdoor Adventure, Engineering for Juniors and Up, Eco Action C/S/A, Mama Stump Trail (has the Eagle info and binoculars, Jeweler (although recently retired — girls love this one), Letterboxing...ready this Fall. Sunspot open all year long at no charge. Use tubs there or take to your campsite. We follow the honor system.
- Archery Range: Temporary range at end of playing field. Secure an archery level 1 or 2 instructor before making your reservations. Use forms #2150 camp rental and #1086 for equipment rental.
- Dot open until the end of September.

- Judith Creek Trail: Blaze Neon Yellow. Rating: moderate
- Great Excursion Trail: Blaze Yellow. Rating: moderate to challenging
- Skinny Dip Hole Trail: Blaze Purple. Rating: moderate
- Mama Stump Trail: Blaze Light Green. Rating: easy to moderate
- Guill's Hill: Blaze Peach. Rating: moderate
- Trail '51 Trail: Blaze Peach and connects to Guill's Hill. Rating: easy to moderate
