Allison custom made 35" X 23" cot style beds for dogs up to 100 lbs. using a top made out of heavy duty easy to clean vinyl and PVC pipes providing orthopedic support, and comfort keeping the dogs off the floor. She also custom made cat beds each with a raised perch. The long legs created a cozy nook underneath the bed giving a shy cat a private spot perfect for napping. Her third design included the creation of a 5 tier 21" X 30" X 46" multilevel cat tower for exercise and amusement to help relieve stress and boredom of indoor cats. - Council Resources and Lending Library located at GSVSC headquarters in Roanoke...has a community library that includes song books, lots of handbooks, badge workbooks, historical scout books, books on games and more. May be checked out on site by using "Check Out Resources Box." Also available are numerous historical GS uniforms and cookie costumes to borrow. Contact Customer Service at info@gsvsc.org to borrow these items/check out the "Girl Scout Suitcase."
- This would be the time to schedule your time to use the **archery range** (Camp Sugar Hollow, Camp Sacajawea or Icimani) archery equipment usage is available at all three program centers to certified archery instructors who provide archery activities to Girl Scout groups/troops on site. A copy of current Level 1 or Level 2 certification is to be on file with council at time of reservation. Approved application for archery equipment (form #1076) is required three weeks prior to the archery activity. A \$50 deposit is required for the equipment. Equipment approval does not reserve the camp or archery range. Please reserve camp/range (form #2150) before reserving equipment to ensure space is available. Must have a valid Level 1 or Level 2 certified archery instructor with you at all times while on range.
- To Lock a Truist Debit Card: This is a new feature for our troop leaders ""Debit Card Controls." Truist allows users to lock their debit cards. Top menu select "more" and then select "Card Controls." Once in the card control screen select the lock button. A very nice safety feature charges cannot be made against your GS troop account unlock as needed.

- Product Sales

- Candy Nut '21 146 troops participated (765 girls = 7% increase from last year).
 Total card orders and online sales was \$221,000.
- Cookie Sales '22 to date 187 troops are participating initial order 16,188 cases delivered (83% higher than last year's initial order)

Highest Awards

- When thinking about a highest award project – "The **project is** the **solution to** the **problem**/concerns you have identified."

- Bronze Award

- Highest Award earned by a Junior Girl Scout (4th and 5th grade)
- Must complete a Junior Journey before starting project
- Each Junior is **required** to complete a 40-45 minute virtual or in person **training** and the team's advisor the additional 60 minutes
- Project does not require pre-approval of GSVSC, unless you plan to create/build on council properties (Camp Sugar Hollow, Camp Sacajawea, Icimani) or if you plan to request a grant
- Minimum project hours, 20 per girl...40% planning hours and 60% project hours
- Project focus is something the girls care about and what they want to improve either within their GS community or local community
- Girls develop an understanding of sustainability and implement this into their Bronze Award project
- Final report submitted on line by the team's advisor, deadline 9/15 form #2752.
 The deadline to complete final report of a 5th grader is September 15 following graduation from 5th grade

- Silver Award

- Highest Award earned by a Cadette Girl Scout (6th, 7th and 8th grade)
- Must complete a Cadette Journey before starting project
- Each Cadette and her team's advisor are **required** to complete a **2 hour workshop** either virtual or in person
- Cadettes may work as a small group of 2 4 girls or solo. Each group/team has
 its own advisor. Team's advisor (usually leader mom, etc. must be a registered
 Girl Scout)
- Silver Award project requires pre-approval by GSVSC (2732)
- Pre-approval project plan is also required if you plan to work on council properties
- Minimum project hours per girl is 50, 30% planning hours and 70% on actual project
- Project focus is something girls care about and what they can do to improve their Girl Scout community or local community
- Project must include sustainability
- Final report is submitted on line by each individual girl even if a group project (2733). Deadline 9/15. The deadline to complete final report of an 8th grader is 9/15 following graduation from 8th grade.
- Silver Award is a great spring board toward Gold

Gold Award

- Highest Award earned by a Senior/Ambassador Girl Scout (9th, 10th, 11th and 12th grades)
- Must complete two grade level Journeys or earn the Silver Award and complete one Journey
- Projects are individual/girl-led
- Pre-approval of project proposal is required

- Preapproved project plans is also required if you plan to work on council properties
- Gold Award training is required
- Minimal project hours is 80, 20% planning hours and 80% project hours
- Gold Award project must include provision to ensure sustainability
- Final report submitted on line
- Council guide on gsvsc.org web site "Go gold"

Periodically check the GSVSC calendar for highest awards training dates

- Triump Award

 For those Girl Scouts within our council who have earned all three awards (Bronze, Silver and Gold), they may apply to GSVSC to earn the Triump Award.
 Triump Award recipients are honored by GSVSC with a life time membership.

 - Your years in Girl Scouting does matter and provides you with opportunities to mentor younger girls...show commitment
