The "Camp Program Center Procedure, Rules and Forms" manual #2170 is current. You must read and review anytime you plan to use our camps. It is online. "Camping and Things to Do at Camp Sacajawea" is on the Lynchburg Campbell County website at www.lburgccgirlscouts.weebly.com. This also includes the forms needed for archery, canoeing, info on letterboxing, etc. plus a nice history of our 68 year old camp. If you need any assistance with planning a camping trip whether tent/cabin camping or just coming for the day at Sac, please do not hesitate to contact us at LynchburgCampbellCoGirlScouts@gmail.com.

When **Cabin Camping at Sac**, particularly when using Gay Lodge or Bunkhouse, please remember to clean kitchens and bathrooms, including sweeping and mopping, emptying all trash cans, putting out new bags, toilet paper and roll of paper towels.

For **leaders** planning any **overnight trip** for your troop you are now required to take **GS 201**, about a 45 minute on line video. This would include any camping trip, sleepover. . . whatever the overnight might involve. Please make sure you complete this training before you submit your Activity and/or Permission Application for a Troop/Group Form 2129 to GSVSC.

No Ride – Share programs such as Uber, Lyft, Curb or any other similar ridesharing companies. No private rentals such as an Airbnb, VRBO, Flipkey, Roomarama, Home away, Vay Stays, Tripping, Winder, Archsurfing or any other similar private rentals

Finance Policy VF8

 Adults may not conduct money-earning activities under the Girl Scout name to support their own participation in an activity unless they have direct responsibility for supervising a group of girls during the activity for which the money is being earned.

Procedures: Volunteers may only receive reimbursement for expenses as long as these cost were planned and budgeted prior to the activity, the adult participated in the council-approved money-earning activities to offset these cost to the troop and the adult had a direct responsibility for supervising a group of girls during the activity for which the expenses are being reimbursed.

Procedures: Girls earn money only for the troop funds do not belong to individual girls, only to the troop as a while

Troop funds are to be used to purchase supplies for troop program activities, membership dues, purchase earned recognition insignia or uniform components and pay for girls to participate in program-related activities.

Troop expenses can cover the cost of the troop volunteer required to properly supervise girls for activities (**adult-to-girl ratio**) as long as the volunteers follow the procedures under VF8. Troop funds are not meant to be spent on family members that want to tag-a-long.

First Aid Certification

- Council approved First Aid/CPR/AED class providers
 - American Red Cross
 - American Heart Association
 - National Safety Council
 - American Safety + Health Institute
 - Medic First Aid
 - SOLO (Stonehearth Opening Learning Opportunities)
- Caution: First Aid/CPR training that is available entirely online does not satisfy Girl Scout's requirements. Such courses do not offer enough opportunities to practice and receive feedback on your technique. Get approval from council prior to enrolling in a course with any online component.
- The presence of an advanced first aider (MD, EMT, etc.) is required at resident camps, day camps...For large events, with 200 people or more there should be additional first aiders, one advanced first aider for every 200 participants. The following healthcare providers may serve as advanced first aiders for large groups: physician, physician assistant, nurse practitioner, registered nurse, licensed practical nurse, paramedic, military medic and emergency medical technician.

 - o 20% discount
 - Expiration date: 9/16/22
- Wilderness First Aider: if you will not be able to get help within 30 minutes (arrival time/minimal cell service with you) you will need a WF Aider.
