Cookies/Cookie Booths

- All troops must be registered to participate. Troop's product sales manager must be registered with troop and complete GS 105 training online (20 minute workshop)
- Double check that all girls are showing up on Troop's Member Profile so their orders will be processed. Troop's primary co-leader will have this information.
- Double check that parents have signed permission form so their daughter can participate.
- If your initial order was made January 5, expect cookie delivery January 16 or 17. Detria will let you know as soon as she receives confirmation. Next time to place your order is January 26.
- There will be a cupboard this year. Use cupboard to help fill needs in between orders and to possibly help fill smaller orders toward end as cookie sales wrap up.
- By January 19, all troop rosters need to be confirmed. By that date you should have taken a look at your troop roster in ABC Smart Cookie and confirmed that all girls participating in cookie sales are there. If they aren't, let Detria know as soon as possible.
- This year troops at any age level can opt out of incentives. For those troops that are opting out, Detria must have signed opt out forms by February 1.

- Please consider letting the girls have at least one cookie booth. Part of our job as leaders is to help teach our girls the importance of a good work ethic. Work ethics are part of what makes us successful and having a booth sale at an early age teaches the most basic of good work ethics. The girls develop a sense of accomplishment and pride. They learn when they are enthusiastic about their product they often sell more. They learn to be careful with other people's money, thank people for their purchase. And if people don't buy, thank them for their interest. A booth sale is a perfect place to develop good work ethics and values. Needless to say, the girls love "working" a booth sale. We just don't need to overwhelm them or overvalue the end results.
- There are designated areas for cookie booth set up at each location. If your site description does not contain this specific information, please check in with a store manager upon arrival and ask where they would like you to set up. Most locations will place the cookie booth outside. Plan and dress accordingly. While it may not be practical for the girls to wear their vest/sash/tunic, only to have them covered by a heavy coat, please consider how you may present yourselves as Girl Scouts and as a troop. If you are placed indoors, be sure you are requesting uniforms be worn.
- As a troop, you need to provide a table, some kind of banner/sign with the troop number on it and a sign indicating that cookies are \$5.00 per box.

- There are some great ideas offered by GSVSC to "bling" your cookie booth; please share these with your girls, www.gsvsc.org/cookiesale In the Skyline Shop there is a cookie marketing kit for \$25 that includes a
- 24 x 12 cookie yard sign, cookie car magnet, table and tote bag.
- We would suggest some kind of decorated collection box for those customers wishing to buy a box to support our military overseas and at Walter Reed Medical Center. Consider providing index cards/pens/tape in case they want to write a message. These boxes will be collected toward end of cookie season (given to Rebecca). For safety reasons there must be 2-3 Girl Scouts and 2 adults at the booth at all times. If you are at a location where you are covering more than one table/entrance, you need to have at least 2 Girl Scouts at each entrance and at least 1 of the 2 adults. If you do not have sufficient coverage for both entrances, just set up in one location. You do not solicit monetary funds at your cookie booth, whether it be for the military or for your troop. For instance, do not put out a collection jar or box for "Troop Donation." Sometimes customers will give a troop a small cash donation; this is acceptable. This money is not included with your cookie sales but entered separately on your end of the year financial work sheet under "Donations/Other".
- Be courteous at all times; do not harass store customers. You may politely ask them if they would like to purchase a box of Girl Scout cookies, but do not run up to them, follow them into the store or block their entrance/exit of the store. Be polite at all times, regardless of how you are treated. Begin to pack up your booth 5 10 minutes before your ending time so that the troop following you can set up in a timely fashion. Remove all trash, including empty cookie boxes and take it with you when you leave the site. Include any of your own trash. Consider providing the store manager with a thank you note and/or box of cookies as a thank you for allowing us to have a cookie booth at their location.
- Parents working cookie booths should have completed a GS Volunteer Application.
- Collecting bad cookie debts. GSVSC has a 50% to 60% success rate in collecting bad cookie debts over \$100, and this could take several years. Under \$100, troops must absorb the loss from their profit. So please remind parents of their responsibility to the girls and troop to avoid bad debt and to turn in their cookie money on time.
- Cookie incentives begin to arrive anytime from mid toward end of May. They do not come from Roanoke (headquarters) but from the different vendors contracted by the ABC bakery. There are maybe 3,000 plus items all of which need to be pre sorted and counted prior to your pick up. Takes about 3 hours. Tentative plans are to start this process Thursday,

June 7, prior to the Leader Appreciation Dinner since we already have the room/seven tables needed. Plan is for each leader/cookie parent to bag their own. So even if you can't stay for dinner, plan on having someone from the troop stop by. As we get closer to the date and have a better understanding of how much sorting is required then we can provide a better window of time. Thank you. This is a major task and all help is appreciated. This will also assist in cross checking your troop's items.

 This year cookie booth lottery will be by way of Google Doc. Sarah is ready to go but we wait for confirmation from three vendors (specific dates and times). We know you are anxious as we are anxious to hear from them.
