We hosted the Girl Scout Cookie Fest/Cookie Cook Off (thanks to Julie) and used the profits to help Marc purchase a new platform tent at Hideaway.

We have been greatly served by our local volunteers and thank them many, many times over for their day to day work "running the operation" of the LCCGS Service Unit, everything from budget planning, event planning, continuing education, recruitment, mentoring, product sales and more! A great deal of volunteer effort and hours go into planning so that SU meetings, events, activities and trainings at the SU level are valuable.

The Lynchburg Campbell County Service Unit was directly involved in supporting numerous service projects locally and two internationally this '18-'19 scouting year.

- 1. "Kid's First," providing 500 small stuffed animals to Dr. Billy Andrews and his mission team to Central Mexico
- 2. Provided 30 pillow case dresses for a community in Africa, carried by the Adventurers
- 3. Thanksgiving Turkey boxes for 30 selected families with HumanKInd. Each well decorated box was filled with food for delivery to a family of six to have a

Thanksgiving meal.

- 4. Provided over 100 coats and warm hoodies to the Salvation Army Center of Hope
- 5. At our Cadette-Senior Day "Dog Show" the girls built 6 kuranda beds and donated them along with towels to the Humane Society. Filled and donated 80 Christmas stockings for the children affiliated with the Salvation Army Center of Hope
- 7. At Super Service Day the girls donated 450 pounds of food to the Blue Ridge Food Bank; made 250 Thinking of You cards that were shared with the residents at the Gretna Rehab Center, to our Women Serving in the Military and the Summit; and filled 92 beautifully decorated birthday boxes for Meals on Wheels
- 8 Participated in the Festival of Trees at the Alan B. Pearson Cancre Center by decorating the Girl Scout"Tree of Hope" with over 250 SWAPs. The tree was auctioned and brougt in \$160 for the Patient Support Fund at the Cancer Center...providing needed transportation and wigs.
- 9. During World Thinking Day the girls hand decorated 60 gift bags and made over 80 Thinking of You cards for the patients at the Alan B. Pearson Cancer Center and for our Women Veterans. The girls also donated hundreds of school supplies for the HumanKind Back to School Program, enough to fill 15 packpacks.
- Toiletry Items brought to the Sweetheart Dance were donated to the Miller Home for Girls, Johnson Senior Center in Amherst and the Shelter for Battered Women (DVPC).
- 11. This year the girls donated 400 boxes of cookies to our military serving overseas and to the veterans at the Salem VA and the Lakeside Drive VA medical office.
- 12. Wreaths Across America, December 2018, we placed three wreaths at the Old City Cemetary.
