Volunteer Finance Policy Update

 VF6 Procedure updated regarding additional money-earning projects being carried out without council approval; forfeit of proceeds and no participation in the next product sale cycle.

- New VF12 Policy and Procedures outline IR regulation that safeguard against the use of GS funds to the private benefit or interest of individual; affects GS nonprofit status
- Troop money; \$ belongs to troop not to individual girls.

Troops not registered by the end of November will be deemed as disbanded troops. GSVSC will move to close their troop accounts. Funds will be held for one year in case the troop decides to register within this 12 month time period. Beyond that point funds will be moved to the GSVSC general fund. Troop Finances Best Practices

- Financial Goals:
- The troop plans and finances activities with guidance of co-leaders. The girls can and should be part of the troop financial management by helping to track funds and make decision on how money should be spent.
- For girls gain business and financial literacy skills appropriate to their age level.
- For girls to understand that they must do their part to help the troop earn money to accomplish the things they want to do.
- For girls to apply business and financial literacy skills gained in Girl Scouting throughout their lives.
- For Girl Scout troops to be self sustaining through participation in Product Sales.
- Troop Bank Account
 - Each bank account must have at least two unrelated troop signers from the troop. The third signer is one of the SU's finance facilitators.
- Finance tips
 - Consider an accordion type folder with tabs to label each month.
 - Place each month's receipts, deposit slips and bank statements in corresponding slot.
 - Keep a receipt book handy and carry it with your troop bank card/checkbook.
 - Label receipts at time of purchase.
 - Label all receipts by category from Finance Worksheet.
 - Staple receipts, slips, etc. to monthly bank statement.
 - When you receive your monthly bank statements attach all deposit slips recorded on that bank statement to that statement.
 - To save money, consider ordering checks through online from reputable companies rather than through the bank.
- Best Practices:
 - Review and keep all monthly bank statements.
 - Keep all receipts. There should be a receipt for every expense.
 - The person managing the GS bank account must retain copies of the troop's EOY finance report, receipts and bank statements for a minimum of 3 years.

- Troop bank statements should be shared with girls and parents to encourage financial literacy and a girl-led environment for goal setting and troop planning as well as financial transparency.
- Avoid using cash when at all possible.
- Keep copies of all reimbursement checks. Do not write reimbursement checks without first receiving a receipt for the purchase. If reimbursing multiple transactions, write a reimbursement check for each transaction (do not "lump" them together).
- Never write a reimbursement check to yourself (the other signer on the account must write it to you and sign with their name).
- GS money must be held in a checking at either First Citizens Bank, BB+T, Union First, Bank of Botebount, First and Citizens Bank or Grayson National Bank...bank that offers on line banking
- Girl Scouts are not permitted to solicit monetary donations, but may solicit donations for goods (craft supplies, first aid kit supplies, etc.)

First Aid Certification

- Council approved First Aid/CPR/AED class providers
 - o American Red Cross
 - American Heart Association
 - National Safety Council
 - American Safety + Health Institute
 - Medic First Aid
 - SOLO (Stonehearth Opening Learning Opportunities)T
- Caution: First Aid/CPR training that is available entirely online does not satisfy Girl Scout's requirements. Such courses do not offer enough opportunities to practice and receive feedback on your technique. Get approval from council prior to enrolling in a course with any online component.
- The presence of an advanced first aider (MD, EMT, etc.) is required at resident camps, day camps...For large events, with 200 people or more there should be additional first aiders, one advanced first aider for every 200 participants. The following healthcare providers may serve as advanced first aiders for large groups: physician, physician assistant, nurse practitioner, registered nurse, licensed practical nurse, paramedic, military medic and emergency medical technician.

 - o 20% discount
 - Expiration date: 9/16/22
- Wilderness First Aider: if you will not be able to get help within 30 minutes (arrival time/minimal cell service with you) you will need a WF Aider.
